### Unit 1 – Review

#### Exercise 2: Read and choose the correct answers.

1. A

**Explanation:** You rarely see a real zebra in the class. Therefore, if it happened, you would feel extremely surprised. Amazed means extremely surprised.

2. C

**Explanation:** “Disappointed about” means feeling unhappy because someone or something was not as good as you hoped or expected.

3. C

**Explanation:** “Relieved” means happy that something unpleasant has not happened or has ended.

4. B

**Explanation:** “Angry about” means having a strong feeling against someone who has behaved badly.

5. B

**Explanation:** Both “brilliant” and “brave” start with /br/.

6. C

**Explanation:** “Bright” includes sound /br/ but the others include sound /pr/.

7. A

**Explanation:** “We” is the subject in both clauses. “Ourselves” refers back to the subject “we”.

8. C

**Explanation:** “Holly” is the subject in both clauses. “Herself”, a reflexive pronoun, refers back to the subject Polly.

9. A

**Explanation:** “Hers” replaces “Bestie’s photos”.

#### Exercise 3: Listen and choose the correct answer A, B or C.

1. A

**Clue(s):**

1. *What did the girl buy for her friend's birthday?*

Girl 1: Did you get a present for Molly's birthday? At the shopping mall?

Girl 2: I did in the end, but it took ages. She's got tickets for Johnny Holden's concert. She loves his music and she's going on her actual birthday. There was no point buying her any of his CDs, she's got them all. Then I saw that his autobiography had just been published, so I got her that. She can read it while she's listening to his music.

Girl 1: Great idea.

2. C

**Clue(s):**

2. *When will the science fiction films start?*

Girl: Are you ready, Andy? The film starts at 6:30 and we've got to meet Paul outside the cinema.

Andy: He'll be there at 6:15. We won't arrive much later than that but I'm sure our film doesn't start so early. Look here in the cinema program, there are two films in this evening. The one about a high school concert starts at 6:30.

Girl: Are we seeing that one?

Andy: No, look 6:45, Flight to Mars. The science fiction hit Starring Krakow van. That's the one we're seeing.

Girl: Oh, all right.

3. B

**Clue(s):**

3. *Which poster will the boy hang on his bedroom wall?*

Girl: Have you been shopping today?

Boy: Yeah, I got a new poster for my bedroom. I've been looking for one for ages. I wish I'd bought it when I first saw it in the shop near where we stayed when we went snowboarding.

Girl: Oh yes. They had lots of fantastic posters there. Was that amazing picture of the bird flying over the mountains?

Boy: It's an eagle. And the photo was taken by the famous mountain climber Jerome Blanc. It's favorite poster ever. I'm really glad I've got it at last.

**Clue(s):**

4. *How did the girl travel to school this morning?*

Boy: You're a bit later than usual, Polly. Was the school bus delayed again?

Girl: No, I didn't take the bus. It was my dad's fault he was late leaving for work. So his car was still in the garage. I kept my bike behind his car, and I couldn't get it out till after you left. So I didn't leave home till 7:50 and then I had to go and meet Jess as we sometimes ride to school together. I think I might get the bus tomorrow, though.

**5. B****Clue(s):**

5. *What will happen first in the school show?*

MC: Welcome to the end of year school show. I'm sure you're all as excited as I am about tonight's performances. But before we start, I'd first like to say, thanks to Mr. Right, the music teacher who's worked so hard with the school orchestra over the past few months. Our fantastic singing group, Star sounds will be on stage in just a few minutes. But now please give a warm, welcome to our own magnificent master of magic and mystery, Joe Hart.

**Exercise 4: Drag the words or phrases into the correct places to answer the following questions.**

1. apartment, cottage, house

**Explanation:** The question asks for the accommodation.

2. once a month, normally, usually

**Explanation:** The question includes "how often" so the answer should include an adverb of frequency such as once a month, usually, etc.

3. travel around the world, learn another language

**Explanation:** The question asks for action.

**Exercise 5: Look at the text in each question. What does it say? Choose the correct answer A, B, C or D.**

1. A

**Explanation:** "Get one free" means the shop gives the customer another film.

2. B

**Explanation:** “A person in difficulty” in this situation means a person is in danger.

3. A

**Explanation:** “Video” means “record” or “tape”.

4. B

**Explanation:** “Making a reservation” means “booking”.

5. A

**Explanation:** In the note, the sender said that Kim couldn’t join the match, Ben needed Greg to play, and Dave would go with Greg.

**Exercise 6: Read the email, match the names with each part of the email.**

1. D. I'm so happy you can spend a fortnight at my place.

**Explanation:** It’s “Brilliant!” part. It means that the writer wants to give a compliment or show his feelings for something mentioned in the previous letter.

2. E. It’s comfortable, with modern furniture, big windows and a large balcony where I sometimes have barbecues at weekends.

**Explanation:** It’s “Describe it” part. It means that the writer wants to describe something. Only option E actually describes something.

3. B. See you in the summer!

**Explanation:** It’s “Say goodbye” part. It means that the writer wants to say farewell. Only B and F express that meaning but the letter mentions they will meet each other in the summer, not spring. Therefore, the answer must be B.
